The enclosures describe the organization as "non-ideological, non-denominational, and non-racial," and state that its purpose is to furnish "moral protection to the people and culture of various countries against the threat of atomic war."

SUBJECT: ALLIED SCIENTISTS OF THE WORLD
Information Concerning

[redacted] (son of [redacted]) called today and as you know he is an [redacted] telephone [redacted]. He stated that his office has been in receipt of correspondence from their members in the very recent past indicating they have been contacted by the Allied Scientists of the World, 941 17th Street, Denver, Colorado, with respect to this organization. [redacted] stated that the literature put out by the Allied Scientists of the World was suspicious to say the least to him and he was fearful that it might be some sort of a subversive organization in the making. He said according to the literature it was organized after the first atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima but according to his information the inquiries in connection with recruiting started in the recent past. He wondered if there was any information we could give him with respect to this organization.

I checked with the Internal Security Section of the Domestic Intelligence Division and ascertained we do not have such information on the Allied Scientists of the World but we had some recent inquiries, particularly one from the Atomic Energy Commission since information had been received that the organization was in the process of collecting statistical data on atomic energy. We are in the process now of investigating the organization. [redacted] stated that the Communication Secretary of the organization was one Agnes Dobson and we have no information in our files or the files of the Denver Division concerning her. The Denver Office has advised the Bureau that they have had no previous information with respect to this organization. As indicated, an active investigation is presently being conducted to ascertain the sponsors and the people behind this organization.

I called [redacted] and told him we had no information of any value to him in connection with his inquiry and we had only received recent information with respect to this organization contrary to the information he had furnished that it was organized after the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima. [redacted] stated it was his impression that it was a recently organized group and as indicated he is suspicious of it because of some of the terminology in the literature. The organization appears to be for peace, personal security, economic welfare of its members and the collection of scientific information for the benefit of its members. [redacted] stated that he would send the Director some of the literature which his office has received with respect to the organization. I thanked him for his thoughtfulness in this regard.

The foregoing is submitted for record purposes at this time.

Yesterday I received a call from [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that he had received a letter which was a type of prospectus and headed as follows:

"Allied Scientists of the World
 Communications Office America
 941 - 17th Street
 Denver, Colorado"

This letter is signed "Agnes Dobson, Secretary to the Board of Governors." It solicits his membership at a fee of \$25, but [REDACTED] stated it was the strangest prospectus he had ever seen, that there were numerous general statements which raised a big question in his mind even though they were not definite enough to be of any specific value. The letter stated that the first stages of the program had involved planning and selection of sites; that while the plans of the organization were not in conflict with the U. S. Government, they took into consideration things which had been overlooked by the Government; that the organization was now ready to activate the second stage and that they had relaxed certain select requirements in increasing their membership. It went on to state that as an outstanding man in his field, he had been selected as a potential member.

[REDACTED] said that, of course, he wanted no part of any such organization even though they may not be "wrong," but he felt the Bureau should have this information for whatever action we desired to take.

We have made a check of the files and find no reference to either the organization or Agnes Dobson.

Because of our knowledge of [REDACTED] and friendly relations with him, there is attached a letter to him for his courtesy. *RJS*

RECOMMENDATION: That the attached letter be forwarded to [REDACTED] and that this information be forwarded to the Domestic Intelligence Division for their consideration. *RA DJP/mek*

DENVER, ADVISES SUBJECT ORGANIZATION SENT HERRY A. CHATELAIN TO DENVER TO CONFER WITH HIM, HOWEVER, CHATELAIN REFUSED TO DISCUSS IDENTITY OF ALLEGED BOARD OF GOVERNORS WITH EITHER P. O. INSPECTOR OR WITH CHARLES S. VIGIL, USA, DENVER, BEFORE WHOM HE WAS TAKEN. ONE HOUR LATER RECEIVED PHONE CALL FROM R. L. HEDDARD, WICHITA, KANSAS, WHO CLAIMED THE HEDDARD DIANOETICS FOUNDATION, TWO ONE ONE WEST DOUGLAS, WICHITA, WAS PARENT ORGANIZATION AND INSTANT CIRCULARIZATION WAS A MEMBERSHIP DRIVE. INSPECTORS THAT CITY FOR FURTHER IDENTIFYING INFORMATION AS WELL AS INFORMATION CONCERNING HEDDARD DIANOETICS FOUNDATION. LA AND SF ADVISED AMSD.

In November, 1951, subject organization mailed letters and literature to numerous scientists throughout the United States and territory advising recipients that they were elected to "fellowship" in the organization and solicited funds. Subject organization established by LAFAYETTE E. HUBBARD of the Hubbard Dianetics Foundation, Wichita, Kansas. Among the many purposes of the organization, the current goal is the furnishing of maximal protection to the people and culture of various countries against the threat of atomic war. Another goal of this organization is the establishment of the means of collection and safeguarding against destruction of existing scientific technology. Organization under investigation by Post Office inspectors for possible violation of mail fraud statute. "Communications Office, America" 941 East 17th Avenue, Denver, Colorado, will be closed on 1-10-52 and moved to the home office in Wichita, Kansas.
